





The 1945 conclusion of World War II was an elating and defining **moment in history.** People's lives were forever altered by the global conflict. Legacy captures the memories of Wisconsin citizens who lived through the horror, and the victory. They returned to mourn the losses and rebuild their lives and communities.

Legacy is the fifth in a series of programs capturing the stories of Wisconsin citizens in uniform and on the home front. These are the people whose prospects were changed by the war, and whose resolve adjusted the course for generations to come.

Wisconsin World War II Honor Roll also is a part of the tribute. It is contained here, and for the first time provides a comprehensive list of all of Wisconsin's fallen soldiers from all branches of service. There were 8,432 who made the ultimate sacrifice on behalf of our country and this moving memorial is but one way to honor them.
